This year's Poppy Days, sponsored by the Legion Post and Unit and VFW Post 5917 have been expanded to include Sunday. There have been requests for Sunday collection times from VFW and Legion members. So here is your chance. The insert included with this newsletter shows the specific start times. We have again set it up for start times throughout the day. The collection periods are shown as two to three hours, but that by no means indicates that one has to stop at the end of the period (except for the evening shift of course).

All starts will be from the Dunkin Donuts at Rt. 53 and Beaconridge Dr. in the Pheasant Hill Shopping Plaza.

This is the only major collection drive which permits the posts and units to retain the funds for use on local area projects to aid with veteran rehabilitation and projects which provide assistance to veterans. It is a very important drive for the Post and Unit.

MAY TO BE A BUSY MONTH

As you can see from the adjacent Coming Events column, May is a very busy month for veterans' organizations. Three major events occur for the Legion: Poppy Days, ROTC/School awards, and Memorial Day.

Poppy Days are addressed in another column.

ROTC/Honors Day School Awards are annual events. The Post provides ROTC General Military Excellence and ROTC Scholastic Excellence medals (with Ribar and certificate) which are presented by a Post representative (often the Commander) to ROTC cadets selected by the ROTC staff of both the Bolingbrook and Romeoville High Schools. The students are selected based on ROTC program established rules and are regarded as significant and prestigious awards.

Honors Day School Awards are presented at the Senior Honors Day program at Bolingbrook High School. These awards consist of the American Legion School Award and Honorable Mention certificates, Gold and Silver Scholastic Awards (medals), and scholarships to the Department of Illinois' Premiere Boys State program.

The *American Legion School Award* is presented to one of five students nominated by the school. Selection by a Post committee is based upon a short essay written by the students as to how their lives display five attributes: Courage, Honor, Leadership, Patriotism, Scholarship and Service. We receive high quality nominations for this award. This will be the third year we have offered this award. The first year's award went to the student who was the commander of the ROTC unit. Last year's award went to the Student Body President. The *Scholastic Awards* are presented to the academic First Place (Gold Medal) Boy and Girl and the Second Place (Silver Medal) Boy and Girl. The awards are presented on neck ribbons Olympic style and the students are acknowledged as that year's Academic Gold and Silver Medalists. The *Boys State Scholarship* is presented to (a) Junior boy(s) who is selected by the school staff on the basis of demonstrated leadership potential. We present at least one scholarship funded by the Post and additional scholarships if corporate/community sponsorship is available.

Memorial Day is always an important event in the calendar of Veterans Organizations. Our involvement starts with helping with the setup of crosses (made by John Iovito of the VFW) the Thursday before Memorial Day. If you can come out to help, just be there about 1:30 – 2:00 p.m. (across from the Veterans Memorial). We can also use help early Memorial Day to set up the Avenue of Flags. These are burial flags displayed in honor of specific veterans. Our observances begin at Boardman Cemetery with assembly about 8:30 a.m. (Legion/Auxiliary cap). Help with the Honor Guard and Rifle Squad is always needed (white shirt, black pants).
